Come visit and learn! The Wisconsin Humane Society Ozaukee Campus presents several age-appropriate programs for classroom groups who are wild about animals. All programs take place on-site where we can guide kids as they watch, listen and learn about the animals who are part of our lives. Programs last one hour and are offered Tuesday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. There is a \$1.50/student fee (10 students minimum) for all programs listed to help support the animals in our care. ### **ANIMAL TALK (K5 – 2nd Grade)**

Is my dog happy? Why does my cat purr? Animals may not speak to us with words, but they have other ways to communicate what they are feeling. Students will be guided through Adoption Avenue using their observational skills to help decipher the language of our companion animals. Understanding what an animal is saying can keep kids safe. Barking, meowing, wagging, stretching, and smiling required!

### **WHS 101 (3rd Grade – High School)**

Get a sneak peak of the journey our companion animals take on their way to Adoption Avenue. Follow in the animals' paw prints and take a behind-the-scenes tour of our Veterinary Hospital, Guest Lodging, and stroll through wonderful Adoption Avenue.
